- 50:22 (law 18.8a)
- Goal line drop-out

- Latching on ball-carrier
- Safety of the jackler



# 50: 22 LAW TRIAL (LAW 18.8 A)




### What's new?

A player can kick the ball from their own half *indirectly* into touch and *GAIN A LINEOUT THROW FOR THEIR TEAM* 

### Why?

Reward precise kicking & encourage defenders to drop back from the defensive line. Less defenders = less collisions



### GOAL LINE DROP-OUT (LAW 12 & 21.16)



#### What's new?

In-goal: A ball held up, an attacking knock-on or an attacking kick grounded by the defence in-goal results in a **GOAL LINE DROP-OUT (SIMILAR TO 22')** 

#### Why?

To save time and encourage attacking play. Goal-line drop out allows for an immediate counter-attacking opportunity.



# FLYING WEDGE / LATCH (LAW 9.22)



#### What's new?

Only one 'latcher': Only one support player may be bound to ball carrier prior to contact with a defender + the 'latcher' must 'reload' and get to their feet after going to ground. **SANCTION: PENALTY TO THE DEFENCE** 

### Why?

Reduce the amount of 3 v 1 contact scenarios that target defenders + increase the possibility of a contest



# **SAFETY OF THE JACKLER (LAW 9.20)**



### What's new?

Player cleaning out must not fall on or attack *lower limbs of* the jackler. Body roll on torso is okay but not falling on legs. SANCTION: PENALTY KICK AGAINST PLAYER FALLING ON LOWER LIMBS

### Why?

Reduce the possibility of injury and encourage a contest at the breakdown

\*New definition (SIMILAR TO 2019-2020 FOCUS AREA)\*

**JACKLER** is a teammate of a tackler who is in a POSITION TO LIFT THE BALL
