Competition Purpose

The purpose of the Saratoga Cup is to foster the growth of competitive Rugby throughout the Interior and Northern regions of British Columbia and provide a final event for the Summer League Competition.

Venue Details

The 2023 Saratoga Cup is taking place at Rocky Mountain Rogues – College of The Rockies, 2700 College Way, Cranbrook, BC V1C 5L7

Parking

• Teams may park in the parking lot indicated below.



Change Rooms

- All Teams will share a changeroom for use prior to and post their match.
- There is 1 changeroom in total and all will be utilized by all teams so please be considerate of teams coming in before and after you.
- Changeroom rules:
 - All teams must vacate the changeroom during your match
 - No gear is to be left in the changeroom during your match
 - \circ $\,$ No alcohol is to be consumed in the changerooms
 - Place all rubbish in the bins provided before you exit
- Please come prepared to play on field.

Food & Drinks

- The Rocky Mountain Rogues will have food onsite and a Beer Garden with food and drinks to be purchased both Saturday and Sunday

Match Schedule

Men's Matches

All matches will have 30minute halves with halftimes to be a MAXIMUM of 10 minutes whistle to whistle. The schedule does allow for overtime so all matches should have full playing time. Remember: any players subject to U19 Law Variations must not exceed 70 minutes of playing time.

Women's Matches

All matches will have 7minute halves with halftimes to be 1 minute whistle to whistle.

Match Protocols

Player Welfare

- Any Player suspected of or suffering from a concussion is to be immediately removed from the field of play and is not permitted to return to play.
- Regardless of any overtime required in Playoff Matches, any Player subject to World Rugby's U19 Variations must not exceed 70 minutes of Playing time in that Playoff Match.

Roster Size & Substitutions

- Men's Rosters are limited to a maximum of 25 players
- Women's Rosters are limited to a **maximum of 15 players**
- Teams may bring 4 additional players into their squad from their regional competitions to meet the minimum squad size, however these additional players must have competed in the Regional Competitions during the summer to be eligible to participate in the Saratoga Cup.
- Per Rule 5.7 (e) Substitutions in Men's & Women's Club Competitions Leagues a Team is permitted an unlimited number of player exchanges. That is, a removed Player may re-enter the Match as and when facilitated by the appointed Match Official.

Playing Enclosure

• Please encourage your supporters to respect the playing enclosure and keep off the field.

- Coaches, team staff & substitutions are asked to remain in the designated technical zones.
- Coaches are not permitted on the field or behind in-goal area.
- Substitutes are asked to warm up in their designated 'attacking' in-goal area without balls or equipment.
- Only team therapists and medical personnel are permitted onto the playing field to attend to a player needing attention.

On-Site Medical Support

- BC Rugby will provide Therapists who are available to support on-field injuries.
- BC Rugby Staff will only step onto the field for an injury if called upon by a Coach, Referee or Therapist.

Match Officials

- All matches will be appointed a Match Official team and all teams will be supplied with radio equipment.
- Appointments will be made by RMOSBC and BC Rugby shall cover costs.
- Please always show respect to Officials give them the space to do their job

Jersey Colour

• Some divisions may require communications between teams to avoid colour clashes. The bottom seeded team will be viewed as the 'away' team and therefore have first choice on jersey colour.

Key Rules of Competition (excerpt)

5.10 Point Tabulations

Competitions of Sevens Rugby – Team standings shall be determined by the total number of Match points earned by a Team in pool Matches, which shall not include bonus points. The allocation of Match points shall be as follows:

- i. Three points for a win.
- ii. Two points for a draw.
- iii. One point for a loss.

iv. A defaulted Match shall count as three points and its score shall be recorded as 5-0 and will count as one unconverted try.

<u>6.1 Tie-Breaking in Team Standings</u>

a) <u>Two-Way Ties in Senior Competitions</u> – in the case of two Teams tied at the end of regular season or all pool Matches, the final standings of the two Teams shall be determined by considering in order of the factors below:

- i. The aggregate score of the Matches Played between the two Teams;
- ii. The most wins in the league or pool;
- iii. The Points Differential in the league or pool Play;
- iv. The toss of a coin by the Chair of the Committee or Tournament Director.

c) <u>Three-Way Ties in Senior Competitions</u> – in the case of a three-way tie at the end of regular season or all pool Matches, the final standings shall be determined by considering the factors, in order, below. If any of the steps results in a two-way tie, then the rules for breaking a two-way tie shall be applied. When Points Differential is used, the Team with the highest point differential will be considered the winner. If seeding is still required for the remaining two Teams, then this will revert to two-way tie breaking rules.

- i. The most wins between the Teams;
- ii. The most wins in the league or pool play;
- iii. The Points Differential in league or pool play between the Teams involved in the three-way tie;
- iv. The Points Differential in league or pool play if all Teams tied Played all their Matches;
- v. The toss of a coin by the Chair of the Committee or Tournament Director.

Section 6.2 - Tie-Breaking in Playoff Matches

If the score is tied at the end of regulation time of a Playoff Match, then the tie shall be broken by the following procedures:

- a) Two five-minute halves of overtime shall be Played.
- b) If the score remains tied, then the Teams shall Play a five-minute period of overtime with the Team scoring first determined as the winner (i.e. sudden death).

c) If the score remains tied, then the Teams shall compete in kicks at goal as directed by World Rugby protocol and confirmed by BC Rugby prior to Playoffs.

Section 6.7 Submitting Team Rosters

All Team Sheets for Playoffs must be submitted to BC Rugby by Friday 9am prior to each Playoff Match. Changes may still be made up until 2 hours after the final whistle and must include all substitutions made. Roster size is consistent with regular season.

Discipline Policy

A player sent off due to receiving a Red Card will not play again during the tournament and the player will have this reported to the BC Rugby Discipline Committee.

There will be no citing commissioner at the event. Match Officials are responsible for reporting any foul play.
