Results

BC Rugby Rules of Competition:

This event is governed by the <u>BC Rugby Age-Grade Rules of Competition</u>.

As approved by the Age-Grade Competition Committee at a meeting held on October 3, all Age-Grade Divisions will be allowed to apply for World Rugby Game on Guidelines in Age-Grade Playoffs (including Mainland and Island Finals as well as Crossover Finals) and utilize smaller team sizes. Should clubs utilize World Rugby Game on Guidelines, this will be indicated prior to the weekend of play.

Scores:

Match scores will be posted on the BC Rugby website and BC Rugby App once reported by the referee of the game. Download the app here on <u>Google</u> or on <u>Apple</u>.

Key Deadlines & Timelines

• **9am Friday Dec 1** - Team Rosters for Playoffs must be submitted to BC Rugby via Sportlomo. All rosters submitted will be checked to ensure Rules compliance.

Pre & Post Match Timelines

- 80 mins pre-KO: Access to allotted changeroom
- 60 mins pre-KO: Exit changeroom, removing all bags from change room
- 5 mins pre-KO: All Teams must be on the field
- Full-time: Shake hands, Runners-up & Winners Presentations On Field
- 10 mins post-match: Access to allotted changeroom

Law Variations

<u>Rugby Canada's Age-Grade Law Variations</u> will be used for this event. Format may change if teams are unable to have a full roster.

Key Rules of Competition for Playoffs (Excerpt)

Section 5.7 Match Day Management:

- a) Under 19 Variation on any given day, any Player aged 18 years or younger must not exceed the number of minutes within a day as prescribed in the Rugby Canada Age-Grade Law Variations for a single match or tournament matches.
- b) **Injury Replacement** no player that is removed due to injury is permitted to return to the Match that they were removed from, unless they have been cleared by the designated team therapist.
- c) **Substitutions** all Matches shall be permitted unlimited player exchanges. That is, a removed Player may re-enter the Match as and when facilitated by the appointed Match Official.

Section 6.2 Tie-Breaking in Playoff Matches

If the score is tied at the end of regulation time of a Playoff Match, then the tie shall be broken by the following procedures:

- (a) First to score during a maximum of two five-minute halves of overtime shall be Played.
- (b) If the score remains tied, the winner shall be determined by considering in order of the factors below:
 - i. The team with the most tries scored during the playoff match;
 - ii. The team with the most converted tries scored during the playoff match;
 - iii. The team with the most penalty goals during the playoff match;

- iv. The team with the most drop goals during the playoff match;
- v. The team that scored first during the playoff match;
- vi. The toss of a coin organised by the Match Official.

Section 6.6 Player Eligibility:

In addition to Player Eligibility for the relevant Competition, the following apply to a Player's eligibility to represent a Club's Team in Playoffs. If a Team has any Player that does not comply with the following, then that Team will be deemed to have defaulted the Playoff Match and the opposition shall be deemed the winner and progress.

- (a) Commitment a Player must have Played at least 50% of the Club's scheduled Matches for the Club to be eligible to represent that Club in Playoff Matches. Playing more than one Match within one week (Monday to Sunday) will only count as one Match towards the Player's eligibility calculation. The Committee will receive applications for exemptions in accordance with Section 8.3.
- (b) **Overtime** regardless of any overtime required in Playoff Matches, any Player aged 18 years or younger must not exceed the number of minutes within a day as prescribed in the Rugby Canada Age-Grade Law Variations for a single match or tournament matches

Section 6.7 Submitting Team Rosters:

All Team Rosters for Playoffs must be submitted to BC Rugby by Friday 9am prior to each Playoff Match. Changes may still be made up until 2 hours after the final whistle and must include all substitutions made. Roster size is consistent with regular season.

Section 8.1 Age Restrictions:

A Team may apply for a named Player to be exempt as an over-age or under-age player from an age-grade following the Age-Grade Exemption process. No Age- Grade Team may exceed three over-age Players per roster, excluding U18 Age Grade. No player is exempted until written approval is provided by BC Rugby.

Per the World Rugby Age Banding Regulations In no competitions should there be any players on team sheets who exceed 3 years in Age difference e.g. a 16yr old cannot

Award Presentations

Award presentations will take place after each final on the field. Medals will be presented to both the winning team and the runner-up.

Medical Information

BC Rugby Medical Staff will be present all weekend (see venue field map). BC Rugby Staff will only step onto the field for an injury if called upon by a Coach, Referee or Therapist. Therapists will be wearing Red Pinnies to identify themselves.

Players may receive assessments or injury management from the Medical Staff at the tent at any time. No taping will take place. Please speak to the therapists directly regarding this.

BC Rugby's number one priority is player safety and adheres to World Rugby's policy of 'Recognise and Remove' when dealing with concussions or suspected concussions.

Any player suspected or suffering from concussion should be immediately removed from competition and report to BC Rugby Medical Staff for evaluation. Not reporting injury symptoms to avoid medical evaluation significantly increases the risk prolonging recovery and long-term effects.

Alternatively, players can be directed to Urgent Care at UBC for evaluation and treatment from a physician for any injury. Please provide documentation to medical tent for completion of the incident and witness report forms.
